GENERAL RULES for the Exhibitor's Hall

General Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors must fill out entry form completely and submit with signed Release and Waiver to Henry Co. Fair office by stated deadline to be eligible to enter.
2. General tags can be picked up at the **Art Hall on Monday, June 16, 2025 between 4 and 6 p.m.** All items must be to its rightful departments by 6 p.m. or item(s) will not be judged, except for Floriculture entries. Please make sure that your entry is in the right class number and that your tags are right. If you need help, ask the superintendent. Failure to have the right tags on the right entry will result in a disqualification. **Doors close and judging begins promptly at 6:30 p.m.**
3. All entries must be the WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR. Except for antique quilts and collections ONLY, in which case you must be the owner. Exhibitor names that appear on any artwork, photos, or on quilts must be covered until after judging. Notes to judges are permitted.
4. Each exhibitor can enter any number entries per class number! If entering two (2) items with the same class number, please enter the class number twice on your entry form; 3 entries, enter 3 times etc. In order for you to get the right number of tags, this must be done. Only entries on your original entry form will be allowed to be exhibited. An item can only be entered under one (1) class number. **No exhibitor can receive more than two monies per class!**
5. All work must have been completed in the last two (2) years, unless otherwise listed. This doesn't apply to antiques, antique quilts, or collections. Any single exhibit entry winning a ribbon or premium at this fair, can reentered only as part of a display entry the following year. The maximum space available for an exhibit is 18"x24", except for table setting. Any class titled "display" may use items in it to make an attractive eye catching display.
6. **Departments where Professional classes are indicated will be considered as the following:** Professionals will be considered as anyone who sells an item on a regular basis for a profit or is a recognized art instructor, photographer, ceramic instructor or anyone who is a business owner of such an establishment or work or works for said business. Amateurs will be considered as anyone who makes an item for a hobby or for gifts or occasionally sell an item.
7. Awards will be made by the single judge system. The judging will be closed. The judge is instructed not to award premiums unless the articles are deemed worthy of merit. If no competition exists and an article is not worthy of 1st premium, the judge may award 2nd or 3rd premium according to their judgment. All judge's decisions are final.
8. If there is any reason to believe that any entry is an attempt to deceive and obtain an award by misrepresentation; the exhibitor may be expelled from showing at the fair for at least TWO (2) YEARS. If there is a problem in any department, please inform the superintendents.
9. The Henry County Fair Association takes reasonable precautions to insure the safety of all exhibits, but in no case will the Fair Association or any of the superintendents be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to the property of any exhibit while it is on the fair grounds.
10. Entries will be allowed to the people of the whole world.
11. **All articles can be removed from the Art Hall between 3-5 PM on Sunday, June 22.** Your premium checks will be available to you at this time. If your entry is not picked up by that time, Rule 8 will apply. If your check is not picked up, the exhibitor will forfeit their premium to the Henry County Fair Association. No premium check will be mailed unless a stamped self-addressed envelope is provided to the fair office.
12. Best of Show will be selected from blue ribbon exhibits in designated Department areas. Next, Judge can award up to 3 Judge's Choice Ribbons per area cited, and any item is eligible, except the Best of Show exhibit. Sweepstakes is awarded on a point system: 1st Place - 3 points; 2nd Place - 2 Points; 3rd Place - 1 Point. The Fair Office will calculate the points and let the Superintendent know who has won.

Junior Department General Rules

All General Rules Listed above and in Fine Arts listed below apply plus the following:

Junior department is divided into two separate groupings, P and P1

Department P is only open to any boy or girl over 8 years of age and under 13 years old as of **September 1, 2024**. **Department P1** is open only to any boy or girl who is **over 13 of age and under 19 years of age as September 1, 2024**.

1. All entries in the P and P1 department must be owned or grown by the exhibitor or the exhibitor's family or the work of the exhibitor. The work must have been completed within the last two (2) years. Any 4-H'ers may enter last year's 4-H item in the Junior or Open Show this year. Any item receiving a premium in the Junior Open may enter the item in next year's open show by itself or as part as a display, rule 1 listed above still applies.
2. Members of the same family cannot use the same recipe in the cooking classes.
3. Junior class will be required to purchase an exhibitor's pass, no exception. Anyone eligible to compete in the P and P1 departments may also exhibit in the Open Shows, without purchasing a second exhibitors pass.

All exhibits must be grown in Henry County or adjoining counties. The exhibitor must be the owner/raiser of the product.

All fruits and vegetables must be on disposable plates, failure to do this will result in a disqualification. Dispose of all buckets of soil by removing from the fair grounds. No dumping of soil in trash cans. Vegetables and fruits will be judged on quality, uniformity, edibility, arrangement and attractiveness. Immature items are allowed in class.

1. Judging: Potted plants will be judged in accordance with size, shape, health, vigor and flowers (if any, quantity and quality). Plants are to be owned and cared for by the exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the fair. Collections of cut flowers will be judged in accordance with the size of flowers, color, length of stem, stiffness of foliage, quality and condition of flowers. Floral ARRANGEMENTS will be judged in accordance with the general effect, proportion, suitability of plant materials, color coordination and initiative of the exhibitor. In the arrangements, the flowers do not have to be grown by the exhibitor, however, arrangements must be the handiwork of the exhibitor and must not vary from the class "theme". Permanent flowers, and or dried, may be used where specified. Do not use "Plant Shine" of any kind.
2. Divisions are open to amateurs. Class 1, 2, and 3 are also open to professionals as are specially designated classes. Professionals will be considered anyone who sells an item on a regular basis or who is a business owner or employee currently working as a floral designer.
3. Due to limited table space, your arrangements will be limited to an area of 18" x 18". No arranging of flowers will be allowed in the Art Hall. Exhibitors must furnish their own containers and accessories with your name and address on the container. Flowers are to be in a glass or clear plastic container or vase.

1.All entries must be homemade and be the work of the exhibitor.

2.Cakes may be single layer except where indicated. Frosting or toppings as desired. Items need to be on disposable plates. Only ¼ of cakes and pies will be required for judging.

3.All entries in the Canning Division should be displayed in uniform measures. Soft spreads, jams, and jellies being exhibited shall be in clear half pint up to pint size jars. The canned fruits, vegetables, pickles & sauces being exhibited shall be in clear half pint, pint, or quart jars. Contents of the jars must be 1 year or less from the date when preserved. No recipes required for canned products. Canned products will not be opened for judging. Judging will be based on appearance, texture, color, liquid level in jar and overall attractiveness.

All canned items **MUST BE LABELED WITH THE NAME OF THE ITEM AND DATE**. Baskets or other items may be used to help make an attractive, eye catching display for classes 1841 and 1851.. The maximum size for an individual display shall be 18"x18".
